## 1. Objectives

- 1. To encourage the telling of stories in a stimulating way.
- 2. To promote using English for oral presentations.
- 3. To develop the confidence of students when performing in front of an audience.
- 4. To encourage students to be good models for promoting the value of story telling.
- 5. To engage an audience by the effective use of voice and body.

### 2. Competition rules

- 1. Any kind of story is acceptable (folk tale, fable, true story etc.)
- 2. Contestants must submit their student name, school name and level along with 5 copies of the printed story to the judges.
- 3. Duration 7 minutes
- 4. If the story takes more or less than 30 seconds outside the allotted time a point will be deducted for each 30 seconds.
- 5. No props.
